Hebrews 12:26-29



Lately, I have been thinking a lot about hope. It usually comes in the form of asking myself "what am I hoping for? In the midst of the crumbling we see all around us, God who is rich in mercy, has given us the incredible gift of His unshakeable kingdom! I'm challenged in this season to put my hope, not in something, but in someone; in that kingdom that is unshakeable and in a God who is everlasting!
