Romans 16:22



This short verse, tucked away at the end of the book of Romans, can seem insignificant at first glance. Compared with the deep truths found throughout the rest of Paul's letter, this is a verse that many of us may have breezed past. However, there are incredibly rich insights contained in these few words.

The name "Tertius" simply means "third." Scholars tell us that this reflects a common practice of how slaves were identified, labeled and viewed in the roman world. Tertius was a slave, born with not enough value to even deserve a name. He was simply the third slave bought or born to his master. Culturally, he was barely considered human and was viewed as an object or resource to be used. Yet, in this verse we learn that he has the important job of transcribing Paul's words. It was through his hard and dedicated work that the inspired words of the book of Romans were shared with believers and passed on to us. Furthermore, he sends his greetings "in the Lord," indicating that he was a fully accepted and significant member of the early church.

The radical power of the gospel changed everything for Tertius. It united him with the family of God and empowered him to serve and work for Christ. All of us, especially the next generation, need to be reminded that we are fully accepted, have incredible worth because of Christ's sacrifice, and have a role to play in building God's Kingdom right now!
